Minutes of a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas held on the 4th day of January 1932 at the hour of three o'clock P.M.

Roll call showed the following present: Mayor Cragin, Commissioners Mundy, German Thomas, Hansell City Attorney Stevens and City Clerk Viola Burns.

All claims allowed as per claims and warrant register on file in the office of the City Clerk.

Reports of City Clerk and Municipal Judge approved by the Mayor.

On motion of Commissioner Mundy seconded by Commissioner Hansell it was moved that a license for the operation of one Stud poker table and one Crap table be granted to Wm. Jones. Mr. Jones presenting proof to the Board that he is sole owner of said business

Vote on said motion was as follows: Commissioners Mundy, German, and Hansell and His Honor the Mayor voting Aye. Noes none.

At this time three new gaming applications were presented to the Board for its consideration, being that of Paxon and Moon, Joe Morgan, and Apache Club. After some discussion on the applications, it was on motion of Commissioner Hansell seconded by Commissioner Mundy moved that the following Preambles and Resolution be adopted:

Whereas, conditions have changed in the City of Las Vegas since the adoption of that certain Resolution by this Board at a recessed regular meeting of said Board on the 13th day of November, 1931, wherein by said Resolution it was provided that until the further order of the Board not more than ten gaming licenses, exclusive of slot machine licenses, be granted for the quarter commencing Oct. 1, 1931 and ending Dec. 31, 1931, and

Whereas, in the opinion of this Board under said changed conditions there is a need and demand for at least thirteen such gaming licenses for the quarter beginning Jan. 1, 1932 and ending March 31, 1932, and the City's interest will be served thereby, and

Whereas, there has heretofore been issued or renewed for this quarter, beginning Jan. 1, 1932, and ending March 31, 1932 ten of said licenses, exclusive of slot machine licenses only, and that the granting for said last mentioned quarter at least thirteen such licenses will not contravene public interest and will not require an excessive amount of police protection under the City's 1931 and 1932 budgets heretofore adopted and the state of the City's funds applicable to police protection, but that the granting of more than thirteen such licenses for said last mentioned quarter will contravene public interest and will require an excessive amount of police protection which cannot be met in view of the provisions therefor made in said City's 1931 and 1932 budgets heretofore adopted and as appears from the present state of the City's funds applicable thereto for police protection.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that until the further order of this Board not more

than thirteen such gaming licenses shall be issued or granted for said quarter beginning Jan. 1, 1932 and ending March 31, 1932.

The vote on said Resolution was as follows: Commissioners Mundy, German, and Hansell and His Honor the Mayor voting Aye. Nones none.

There upon motion of Commissioner Hansell seconded by Commissioner Mundy the following gaming license application was granted:

Vote on said motion was as follows: Commissioners Mundy, German and Hansell and His Honor the Mayor voting Aye. Nones none.

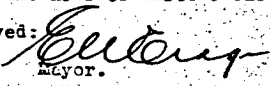
At this time the matter of the consideration of the application of Wayne V. Stocker, heretofore filed, for a Permit to conduct and carry on the gambling game or device of Eighty Ball Keno at the place known as the Northern Club on Fremont Street in the City of Las Vegas, was had by the Board. The City Attorney, to whom the matter had heretofore been referred for investigation and report thereon, reported to the Board that he had investigated the law and the facts with reference to said game of eighty ball Keno, and was of the opinion 1. That it was not a game of Keno as contemplated by Ordinance No. 165 of the City of Las Vegas and/or the State Gaming Act of 1931, in that the method of conduct thereof was entirely different than the game of Keno, the latter game being a percentage game, and Eighty Ball Keno being a banking game. 2. That eighty ball Keno, as now being and heretofore being operated under license from the City, under application denominating the same "Keno", secured from the City Clerk in the last preceding quarter year and without application to the Board of Commissioners of said City, therefore, was and is a lottery, and is operated in all substantial respects as Chinese Lottery, and was not a game or device which could be legally permitted by or licensed by the City of Las Vegas.

After due consideration of the matter, upon motion of Commissioner Mundy seconded by Commissioner Hansell, it was

Resolved, that the application of Wayne V. Stocker for a permit and license to operate an eighty-ball keno game in the Northern Club on Fremont Street in Las Vegas, be and the same is hereby denied on the grounds 1. That said game is not a game of Keno as now and heretofore operated by said Wayne V. Stocker. 2. That said eighty-ball keno constitutes a lottery, and cannot be permitted or licensed by said City, for the reason that such lottery is in violation of the constitution and laws of the State of Nevada.

The vote on said Resolution was as follows: Commissioners Mundy, German, and Hansell and His Honor the Mayor E.W. Cragin voting aye. Nones none.

No further business appearing before the Board at this time the meeting recessed until Friday the 10th day of January 1932 at the hour of three o'clock P.M.

Commissioner Hansell appointed by the Mayor to approve the bills of the finance Commissioner owing to the absence of that officer.

Semi-monthly salary bills allowed.

Minutes of all previous meetings approved as read.

On motion of Commissioner Hansell seconded by Commissioner Mundy the following slot machine licenses granted. Applications being in proper form and monies to cover same being on file with the Clerk.

Vote on said motion was as follows: Commissioners Mundy and Hansell and His Honor the Mayor voting Aye. Nones none.

At this time the Board considered the matter of giving Three Hundred (\$300.00) towards the establishing of an exhibit in the City of Las Vegas of specimens from the Buried City.

On motion of Commissioner Hansell seconded by Commissioner Mundy it was moved that the City appropriate the sum of Three Hundred Dollars from the Publicity Fund towards the establishing of an exhibit of specimens from the Buried City in the City of Las Vegas. Said Three Hundred dollars to be paid to Dr. W.S. Park, Chairman of the Museum Committee in two installments of One Hundred Fifty Dollars each.
