Memorial Monument**

**LIQUOR LICENSE
Modern Market**

Bingham until such time as it is satisfactory to transfer to the new owners, when they become registered voters; further that Mr. Bingham be held responsible for the conduct of the liquor business at this address.

M. at the Commissioner's Room of the Board of Commissioners, in the War Memorial Building, located at the Northwest Corner of Fifth and Stewart Streets, in the City of Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada, as the time and place for a public hearing on said Petition and recommendation, and ordered the City Clerk to cause the aforesaid alley to be vacated to be posted with a Notice setting forth the time and place of the public hearing and the extent of the proposed vacation;

And it appearing from the Affidavit of Charles V. Cudney, filed with the Clerk of this Board, that the Notice provided for in said Order, a copy of which Notice is attached to said Affidavit, was posted on the 18th day of January, 1952, in the manner prescribed by said Order;

5th Street Lighting

A M E N D E D R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, that portion of South Fifth Street hereinafter described, has been and still is without adequate street lighting; and

WHEREAS, numerous requests have been made for the installation of Street lighting along the said South Fifth Street; and

WHEREAS, a Resolution was passed on the 3rd day of October, 1951, ordering the City Engineer to prepare plats, diagrams and estimates of cost for the installation of complete street lighting facilities; and

WHEREAS, the said Resolution must be amended to direct that the said facilities be supplied with aluminum standards; and

WHEREAS, the said installation of said street lighting facilities should be made in an area somewhat different than that area described in the Resolution of October 3, 1951; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas has determined that the public will be better served by the installation of street lighting facilities on South Fifth Street from the South City Limits to a point approximately 730 feet North of the intersection of South 5th Street and South Main Street,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, at a regular meeting thereof held on the 20th day of February, 1952, that the City Engineer be and he is hereby directed to prepare and file with the City Clerk, plans, diagrams, and estimates of cost for the installation of complete street lighting facilities with aluminum standards and single overhead wire on series lighting system in, over, and along South Fifth Street from the South City Limits to a point approximately 730 feet North of the intersection of South 5th Street and South Main Street.
