- A. BILL NO. 90-33 - AUTHORIZES ISSUANCE OF INTERIM WARRANTS
RE: SPECIAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 492.
Committee: Councilman Nolen and Mayor Lurie

No one appeared in opposition. Committee recommended Bill for adoption at the June 6, 1990 Council meeting.

- B. BILL NO. 90-34 - ESTABLISHES LIQUOR CATERER LICENSE AND ABOLISHES
DISTANCE REQUIREMENTS RELATING TO ESTABLISHMENTS THAT SELL
ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES AND IMPOSES SPECIAL USE PERMITS.
Committee: Councilman Nolen and Mayor Lurie

Douglas Shealager, Bartender's Anytime, 4053 Meadow Glen Avenue, appeared. He recommended the Bill be passed as written except for a few areas of concern. He was concerned with the \$2500 license fee up front was too much, plus \$500 semi-annually. He had an objection to the permit being pulled 10 days before an event. Also, the \$50 permit fee is too high.

Councilman Nolen stated he had no problem with granting the licenses to caterers, but he didn't feel that \$2500 was too high a license fee to serve liquor. He stated he couldn't support the 10 days notice. He stated he would go along with a \$25 fee and 3 days notice.

Mayor Lurie stated the recommendation to the Council would be a \$2500 license fee, \$500 semi-annually, \$25 per day permit fee and 3 days notice for event.

Ron Currie, 2901 S. Highland, appeared. He stated that a lot was going to depend on what gets resolved with the tavern changes that are proposed. He had concerns about the definition of what a caterer is.

Mayor Lurie instructed the City Attorney to enlarge on the definition of "caterer".

Ron Currie stated that the way the ordinance is written in such a way that it eliminates the burden of proof to be put on the applicant applying for a use permit.

Councilman Nolen stated that the Use Permit process can allow for a more stringent standard for allowing a bar. It would take a majority of the Council to grant a waiver. He read a letter from Sandy Everly, MADD, in opposition to changing the 1500' rule.

Steve Stein, 520 South 4th Street, appeared. He stated the Use Permit system was an excellent system, but also wanted the 1500' distance requirement.

Bill appeared and wanted the 1500' distance to be from property line to property line.

Bob Keck, 6413 Vicuna appeared. About 40% of the bars or restaurants are owned or controlled by slot machine companies.

Mayor Lurie stated the recommendation on this was going to be that the 1500' distance stays and a Use Permit be required along with the catering portion.

Robert McKinley, 313 Vasser Ln, appeared. He objected to bars be putting in across the street.

Anthony Pecos, 2101 S. Decatur, appeared and was in favor of the 1500' distance.

Mayor Lurie stated the recommendation the Committee is going to make to the Council is that the 1500' stays, Use Permit and no waivers.

Councilman Nolen stated there would be a grandfather clause for those existing.
