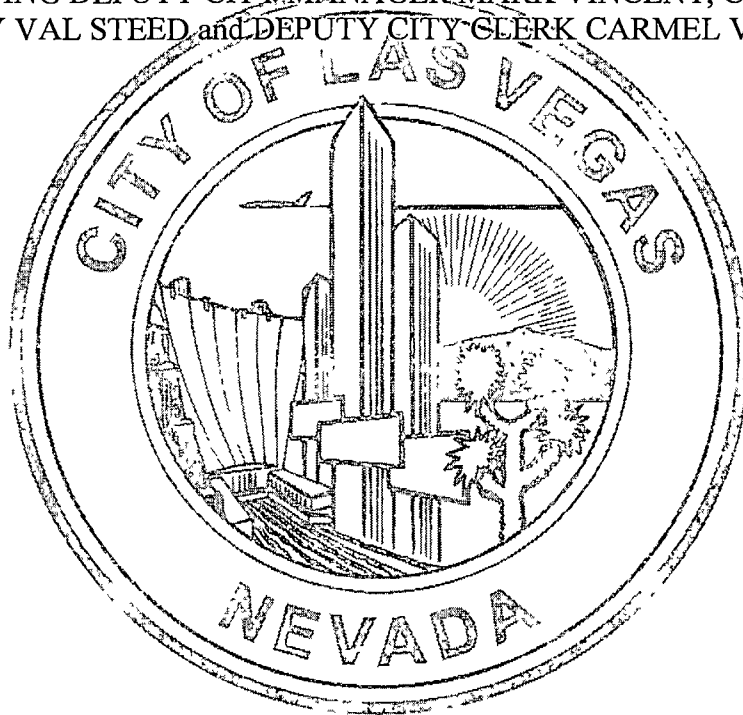

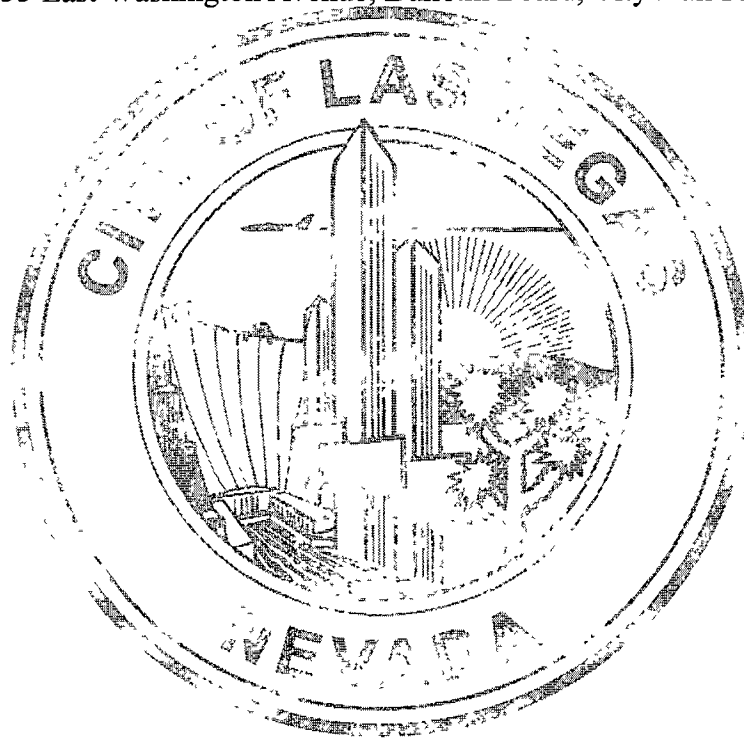

Current code provisions authorize the administrative issuance of a temporary license for a limited number of privileged license categories. This bill would expand that authority to apply to all privileged categories. The administratively-issued temporary license would be good for up to 90 days, and could be extended by the City Council for two additional extension periods not to exceed 6 months each.

**Minutes:**

JIM DiFIORE, Business Services Manager, explained that this item had been held in abeyance to allow staff to draft a First Amendment which allowed the approval process for reflexology, ice cream truck and mobile food vendor business licenses to remain unchanged. The First Amendment would keep approval of both the temporary and permanent licenses at the

administrative level.

ACTING DEPUTY CITY MANAGER MARK VINCENT noted an upcoming bill would address fee enhancements for special services such as fast-tracking temporary licenses. Currently those requests are treated as a priority by staff and, under the upcoming bill, those applicants would pay a premium for priority service and faster approval of their temporary licenses.

CHIEF DEPUTY CITY ATTORNEY VAL STEED stated the effective date would be stated in an additional section in Bill No. 2009-9. He recommended forwarding this item to the Council with approval as a First Amendment and explained that the bill would be held in abeyance to the 4/15/2009 City Council meeting so both bills can be presented to the Council at the same time.

AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE ADMINISTRATIVE ISSUANCE OF TEMPORARY BUSINESS LICENSES FOR PRIVILEGED BUSINESSES, AND TO PROVIDE FOR OTHER RELATED MATTERS.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: Title 6, Chapter 6, Section 10, of the Municipal Code of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, 1983 Edition, is hereby amended to read as follows:

6.06.010: (A) The provisions of this Chapter apply to those businesses which are found by the City Council to require a high degree of supervision and to more seriously affect the economic, social and moral well-being of the City and its residents. These businesses have been commonly referred to as "privileged" and require City Council approval for a license[.] , except for the license categories described in Paragraph (1) of Subsection (B).

(B) For purposes of this Chapter, the term "license approval authority" means:

(1) The Director, for licenses issued under the provisions of Chapters 6.47, 6.55 and 6.69; and

(2) The City Council, for all other categories.

SECTION 2: Title 6, Chapter 6, Section 51, of the Municipal Code of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, 1983 Edition, is hereby amended to read as follows:

6.06.051: (A) At the request of an applicant, the [City Council or, as authorized by Subsection (C), the] Director may grant a temporary license, effective for a period not to exceed ninety days, pending [the Council's decision] final action regarding a license application in order for the license approval authority to determine:

(1) The applicant's fitness for a license; and

- 1 (2) The appropriateness of the applicant's business location.
- 2 (B) A temporary license shall not be granted under this Section unless:
- 3 (1) All principals required to be approved for suitability have submitted a
- 4 complete investigation packet for determination of suitability and paid all applicable fees;
- 5 (2) The Director makes a preliminary finding that all of the principals of the
- 6 business are suitable; and
- 7 (3) The applicant has submitted a completed and accurate license
- 8 application and has paid all required application fees.

9 [(C) The Director shall have the authority to issue temporary licenses under this

10 Section for business licenses within the following categories:

- 11 (1) Ice cream truck;
- 12 (2) Mobile food vendor; and
- 13 (3) Reflexology.]

This bill will amend the Town Center Development Standards Manual to allow a full service or auto detailing car wash in the Service Commercial and Employment Commercial-Mixed Use Districts of Town Center by means of special use permit, and as a conditional use in the General Commercial District. This amendment will correct an error in a previous ordinance relating to this use and will make the process and standards consistent with Title 19.

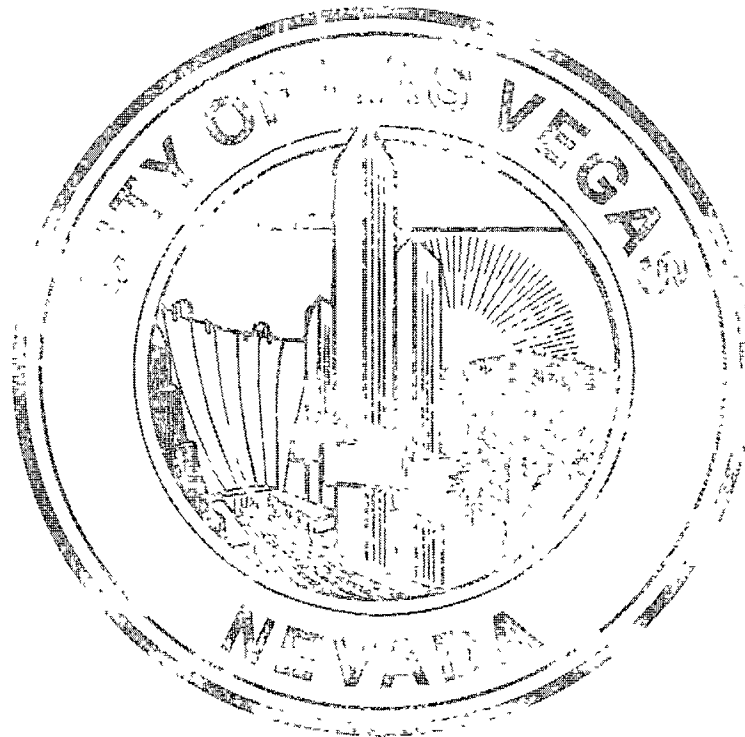
**Minutes:**

CHIEF DEPUTY CITY ATTORNEY VAL STEED stated this bill will clearly define the car wash use as a Special Use for the Service Commercial (SC-TC) and Employment Commercial (EC-TC) Districts within the Town Center Development Standards Manual. Also, it will dictate that car wash is a conditional use within the General Commercial District (GC-TC), meaning that the use has to meet minimum conditions for administrative approval. Under the current Town Center Development Standards Manual, car wash is a permitted use. Under this bill, it would become a conditional use in the G-C district. He recommended approval.

**RECOMMENDING COMMITTEE MEETING OF: MARCH 31, 2009**

COUNCILMAN STEINMAN expressed concern with administrative approval of car washes, noting the impacted neighbors usually complained of noise and traffic from car wash uses. He suggested car wash uses should be reviewed by the Planning Commission and the City Council.

MARGO WHEELER, Director of Planning and Development, explained this use was being added to the Town Center Development Standards at the request of COUNCILMAN ROSS. She clarified that the use would require a Special Use Permit (SUP) in the SC-TC and EC-TC Districts. The use could be administratively approved in the (GC-TC) District if it met the minimum requirements. If staff determined that the use did not meet the minimum requirements, it would be referred to the City Council for their consideration. Also, any Councilmember could appeal any administrative approval within ten days and require approval of a SUP by the City Council.

10 Section 19.06.110(B) of the Municipal Code of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, 1983 Edition, is  
11 hereby amended as set forth in Sections 2 to 4, inclusive, of this Ordinance. In the case of changes  
12 to existing table entries (Section 2) and changes to existing text (Section 4), deletions are shown by  
13 bracketing and additions by underlining.

14 SECTION 2: Table 1 (the Permitted Uses Matrix), as found at the end of Section B.2  
15 of the Manual, is amended by amending the entry for the use "Car Wash, Self Service" to read as

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20 SECTION 3: Section B.3.B of the Manual is amended by adding an entry, at the

- 23 a. The use shall comply with all minimum conditions, standards and requirements  
24 applicable to the use "Car Wash, Full Service or Auto Detailing," as that use  
25 is permitted by means of conditional approval under LVMC 19.04 010.

26 SECTION 4: Section B.4.B.16 of the Manual is amended to read as follows:

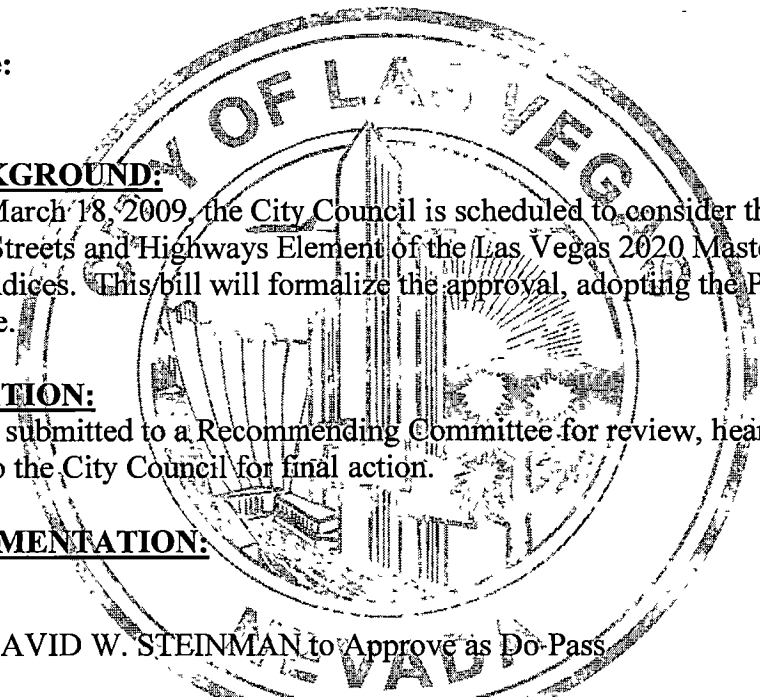

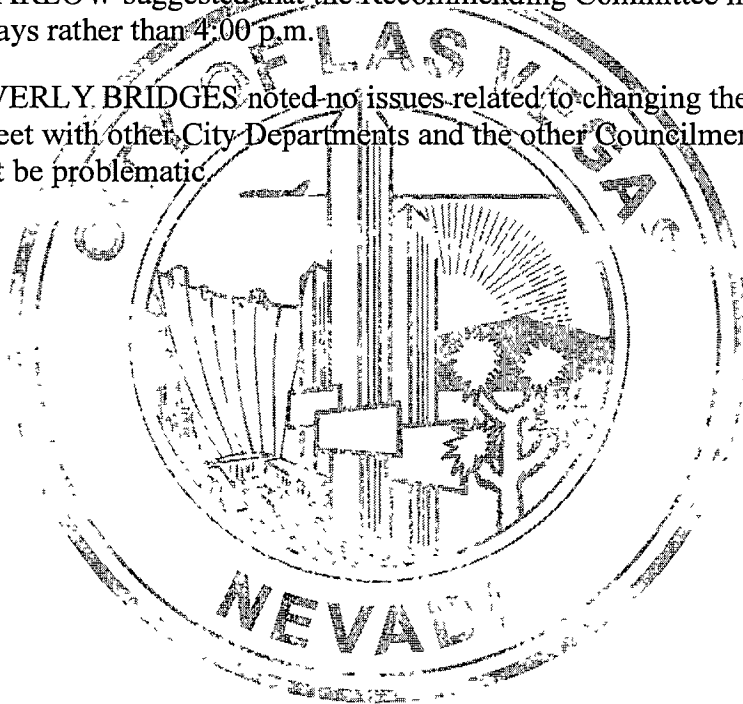
