

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, it is the public policy of the City of Las Vegas to achieve and maintain levels of air quality which will protect human health and safety, prevent injury to plant and animal life, and preserve visibility and aesthetic values; and

WHEREAS, the Las Vegas City Council has been a leader for air quality planning for the Las Vegas Valley; and

WHEREAS, maintaining the compliance of strict air quality standards upon new and existing industries will play an integral part in the improvement of air quality in the Las Vegas Valley ; and

WHEREAS, the Clark County District Board of Health has already taken several important steps toward improving our valley's air quality; and

WHEREAS, such compliance can be accomplished by implementation of the proposed Clark County Clean Air Action Plan (CAAP) which includes a series of thirty proposed measures divided into four major source categories: Industrial and commercial pollution, Motor Vehicle related air pollution, Sources of dust and other forms of air pollution; and

WHEREAS, the CAAP was designed to alert those industries and groups that pollute that they will stop polluting by means of retrofitting existing facilities with available technologies or move locations to a suitable site; and

WHEREAS, the CAAP promotes conversion to alternative fuels by vehicle fleets, urges new measures to capture fuel vapors at gas pumps, calls for new mandates for tail pipe emission reductions and targets \$20 million per year for the Question 10 Transportation Funding.




NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Las Vegas endorse and support the intent of the Clark County Clean Air Action Plan and encourage other governmental entities and the public to unite in establishing a framework of measures to significantly reduce air pollutants in the Las Vegas Valley by first attacking their sources.
