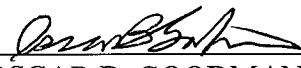

WHEREAS, on January 27, 2000, the Southern Nevada Regional Planning Coalition recommended support of this project to its members;

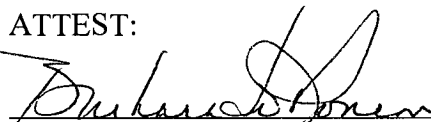
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Las Vegas City Council hereby proclaims its support for the Nevada Film Office production website project.

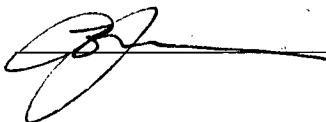

ITEM DESCRIPTION: Resolution in Support of Nevada Film Industry Website

Lieutenant Governor Lorraine Hunt has asked the Southern Nevada Regional Planning Coalition and its member agencies to support the creation of a multijurisdictional film industry "Production Website." The website would serve all governmental entities involved in the permitting and logistical facilitation of production for film, television, multimedia and other related projects. Hosted through the State of Nevada Film Office, using State funds, this first of its kind system will offer simplified service, reduce redundancy and repetition of processes for clients and government staff, provide uniformity and information sharing among entities, save time and money for all those involved, as well as distinguish our state as a production locality nationwide and around the world.

Features will include online maps with jurisdictional boundaries, links to service providers and resource directories, video conferencing capabilities for multijurisdictional coordination and the capability for adaptation and amendment as a production progresses. The client submits information online or in person, which is then disseminated to every entity that will be involved in the process. Each entity can tailor their segment as necessary according to their jurisdiction and authority.

The SNRPC member voted to support the resolution and recommended that it now go before the individual governing bodies for their approval. Resolution Number R-27-2000 will be on the February 16, 2000 agenda for your consideration.
