R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, now has a population of over 63,000 persons; and

WHEREAS, the water supply for said residents is vital to their continuous good health and well being; and

WHEREAS, the present water supply is insufficient to meet the demands of the ever increasing population and commercial interests and it would be in the best interests of the citizens of this municipality that a survey be conducted by the Bureau of Reclamation looking toward the implementation of additional water sources and supply, and toward conservation of our water resources,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, at a regular adjourned meeting held on the 3rd day of November, 1960, that the Department of Interior of the United States of America is hereby memorialized to take the necessary action to cause and permit the Bureau of Reclamation to institute and complete a water survey in and about the Las Vegas Valley Area, said survey to be made for the purpose of supplementing the necessary water supply for this area.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this Resolution be forwarded to the Department of Interior, the Bureau of Reclamation, Director, Conservation and Natural Resources Department, State of Nevada, Senator Alan Bible, Senator Howard W. Cannon and Congressman Walter Baring.
